



# A Story Still Unfolding: Serving You through COVID-19

#### Turning on a Dime

It all started with an unexpected visit from the Governor at a Community College Presidents' meeting – the virus we had all been hearing about on the news was likely headed our way. In order to protect others and save lives, we were going to need to make changes – and make them quickly. In a matter of a week's time, our faculty moved their classes to remote learning, our physical plant team started making preparations to ensure campus safety, and NSCC employees and students started the long journey of finishing the semester from home. Though we are now back on campus serving our students, we had no idea just how long it would take to get here.

Student Success by the Numbers When Northwest State changed to remote learning, our students adjusted to education and communication mostly through a screen. This new and challenging circumstance didn't keep them from finding success – 95% of spring semester students completed their courses on time. We also enjoyed virtual celebrations for 270 graduates and 282 scholarship recipients, who received a total of \$661,000 in scholarship dollars. Our students' desire for learning didn't stop there; Northwest State saw a 10% growth for the fall semester – an increase that demonstrates how education is needed now more than ever.

Together as a Team - Even in Distance It wasn't just students who were navigating

through these new waters of COVID-19. Faculty and staff had to find a way to provide the best education possible while remaining safe at home. Countless hours were spent on video conferences, figuring out how to lead our learners to the end of the semester successfully. Our faculty also worked diligently to provide fun and safe activities at our summer camps. When realizing the tremendous change - and accomplishment that NSCC experienced, faculty member Mike Vanderpool thought to bring together the higher education community for a virtual #OhioLeads Summit. This is where they shared, as Mike says, "what went right, what

went wrong, and what [we] might do differently going forward" in delivering higher education during a crisis.
