What happens if I make a report of sexual harassment to my school's Title IX Coordinator?

The Title IX Coordinator (or designee) will meet with you in person or on Zoom or Teams and discuss supportive measures and take a brief statement from you. You will have all your rights and options explained.

Once the investigation is completed,

you will have an opportunity to review

the investigative report and offer any

feedback you want considered prior to

the conclusion of the investigation.



If you choose to file a signed formal complaint, then the accused person will be notified of the allegation and the complaint will be assigned to an investigation. If you don't file a formal complaint, then the complaint may not be investigated.



When the investigation concluded, you will be invited to attend a hearing. A trained person called a Decision Maker will preside over the hearing. They may ask questions and will make a finding after the hearing has concluded.



During the investigation, you will have the right to present evidence and witnesses. You can have an advisor of your choice with you at every meeting if you like. This can be anyone of your choosing, except a witness in the matter.



You will receive written notice of the outcome of the matter, including the finding, rationale, appeal process, and sanctions, if applicable. The Title IX Coordinator can also implement permanent protective measures at this time.
