

FULL - TIME VS. PART - TIME Traditional students:








NSCC'S ECONOMIC IMPACT

Economic Impact Report:

- Northwest State Community College's service area receives roughly \$110 million in income due to past and present efforts of the College.
 - The impact of the increased earning of NSCC Alumni and the businesses they work for is \$40.5 million in added income.
 - An employee with an NSCC associate degree earns, on average, \$8,700 - \$10,400 more per year than an employee with a high school diploma.


