
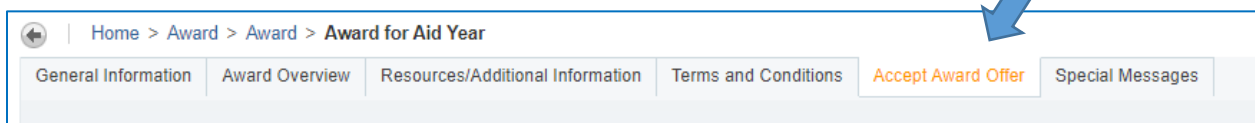


Please follow these simple steps to Accept/Decline your Financial Aid Offers:

- \_\_\_ **Step 1:** Go to [www.northweststate.edu](http://www.northweststate.edu)
- \_\_\_ **Step 2:** Log in to your **myNSCC** account
- \_\_\_ **Step 3:** Click on the **Student Tab**
- \_\_\_ **Step 4:** Select on **Financial Aid**
- \_\_\_ **Step 5:** Select **Financial Aid Year 2021-2022** and click submit
- \_\_\_ **Step 6:** Click on 
- \_\_\_ **Step 7:** Select "View Terms & Conditions. **Read** the information the mark Accept or Not Accept the Terms
- \_\_\_ **Step 8:** Click on the "Accept Award Offer" tab



- \_\_\_ **Step 9:** Accept or Decline any loans by clicking on the drop down box. You may accept a partial award by selecting 'Accept' and entering a dollar amount in the 'Partial Amount Box'

- \_\_\_ **Step 11:** If you are accepting a Direct Subsidized or Direct Unsubsidized Loan, please follow the steps on the reverse side to complete the Entrance Counseling, Master Promissory Note and the **NEW Annual Student Loan Acknowledgment**.

# STUDENT LOAN BORROWERS

All Student Loan Borrowers must complete the Annual Student Loan Acknowledgement.

Select the ‘Complete Subsidized/Unsubsidized Loan MPN’ “Start” icon.</p> <p><b>STEP 4:</b> Follow directions until complete</p>
