Academic Standing

Academic Standing is verified at the end of each semester. Learners remain in good academic standing with a grade point average of 2.0 or higher. Learners are placed on academic probation or suspension when the cumulative grade point average falls below minimum levels. Learners on probation or suspension will work with their academic advisor to develop academic success plans. In addition, learners on probation or suspension will be required to take GSD100 Success Seminar.

SUSPENSION READMISSION

Learners registered for 12 or more credits in a term, with a 3.50 GPA or higher in a given semester.

Learners registered for 6 or more credits in a term, with a 3.50 GPA or higher in a given semester will be named to the Half-Time Dean's List.



Learners will be placed on academic probation at the end of any semester, if their cumulative grade point average falls below the following minimum levels:

Attempted Credits	CGPA
1-15	1.40
16-30	1.60
31-45	1.80
46+	2.00

Learners will remain on academic probation until such time as their CGPA meets or exceeds the minimum levels referenced above. While on probation, students may register for a maximum of 12 credit hours. Learners on probation will be suspended at the end of any semester, if the minimum cumulative grade point average is not reached while on probation.

There will be no suspension if the semester grade point average is 2.00 or if the learner shows significant progress, as determined by the Vice President for Academics.

The period of suspension will be for one academic semester, excluding summer session. Learners are required to develop an Academic Success Plan that is approved by the Division Dean before being released from academic suspension by the Vice President for Academics.

Readmission Steps:

- Meet with your academic advisor to develop an Academic Success Plan.
- The division dean approves your Academic Success Plan.
- The Vice President of Academics approves your Academic Success Plan.
- Your academic advisor will communicate the approval/denial of your Academic Success Plan.

With the approval of your Academic Success Plan, you will be able to register for a maximum of 6 credits.
