Computer Aided Manufacturing (CAM) Short-Term Certificate

The CAM certificate provides students with strong foundation in the reading and creating of blue prints for manufacturing. This includes developing a foundation in computer aided design using Solidworks and the programming of Computer Numeric Controlled (CNC) machines for the precision fabrication of parts.

Course Delivery

This certificate is offered in a highly flexible model. Students complete one course at a time moving at their own pace. Each course is eligible to be awarded one credit hour at a time. Lectures are delivered online asynchronously. Labs are flexibly scheduled with the instructor and are available days, evenings, and Saturdays.
