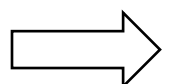


Admissions

- Apply Online to NSCC
- Create OH/ID Account (**New Students Only**) at <https://ohid.ohio.gov>
- Request the **Funding Application** through OH/ID account - Official College Acceptance Letter **or** Preliminary Welcome Letter needed for **new** CCP students or Letter of Good Standing (for current CCP students supplied by NSCC) will be required when completing the Funding Application.
- New This Year** - Complete **Intent Form** through the Funding Application. Will not be a separate form this year as it has been in the past. **Application Opens: Feb. 1, 2020 – Hard Deadline: April 1, 2020 (5:00 pm)**
- Complete & submit, to the Admissions Office, the NSCC **Consent Form** with the student's most recent high school transcript (please see the transcript requirement sheet for more information).
- Complete the Accuplacer test or submit ACT scores (scores must come directly from ACT) prior to March 25, 2020 to allow for processing of your Official Acceptance letter.
Accuplacer Testing Deadline for the 2020-2021 School Year: March 25, 2020

Acceptance

- Complete the CCP Advising and Orientation workshop. You will receive instructions on how to complete this online workshop in your acceptance packet along with your student ID#. You must receive a 70% or better to pass and to be scheduled for classes.
Deadline: Summer Term: May 24 // Fall Term: August 13 // Spring Term: January 7
- Complete the **Online Learning Readiness (OLR) Assessment** if you planning to register for an online class. Completion of this assessment is strongly recommended if the student is unsure of the courses he/she is taking. A student must pass with a 75% or more before he/she will be registered for an online class.
- Review the NSCC Course Listing to see what classes you may be interested in taking. The online schedule can be found at <https://northweststate.edu/calendars-schedules>. The Level One course listing can be found at <https://northweststate.edu/wp-content/uploads/files/CCP-Level-I-Course-List-Updated-3-2019.pdf> Courses taken within the first 15 credit hours **must** be Level One courses.



Advising

- Meet with your CCP Advisor at NSCC to discuss courses you are eligible for and classes that will help you achieve your educational goals.
- Submit a copy of your **CCP Funding Award Letter** to your CCP Advisor. The letter can be found with your OH/ID Account by the first week of May 2020.
- Review, with your School Administrator (i.e. parent), to ensure the classes you plan to take at NSCC keep you on track for high school graduation.
- Complete and return your CCP Registration Form to the NSCC Admissions Office. This form must be signed by both the student and the School Administrator (i.e. parent). The form can be also be emailed to Ann Fether at afether@northweststate.edu or faxed to 419-267-5745.
- Check your myNSCC account to view your class schedule and confirm registration.
- Check your NSCC student email account regularly for important information. This will be your Advisor's and Instructor's main point of contact.

Attend

- Attend the **New Student Welcome Picnic** (August).
- Get Your Books! Homeschool students/families** are responsible for purchasing their own textbooks. **Nonpublic** students should see their high school counselor regarding books.

- Begin classes and please be aware of NSCC class start dates. You will receive a letter prior to the start of classes confirming this information.
